Promote considerate parking	Parking is an issue in the area.	We'll encourage our residents to park considerately as and when possible. We'll also work closely with local schools, the Police, Plymouth City Council, and local councillors to try to resolve the parking issues in Barne Barton and the reports of speeding.	2022/ 2023
Tackling anti social behaviour across the community	Residents expressed their concerns regarding substance abuse and ASB.	We'll be continuing to work closely with the Neighbourhood Policing team. We will be raising awareness campaigns and encourage reporting of any ASB and substance abuse issues to PCH, Crimestoppers and the police.	2022/ 2023
Improve local infrastructure including roads and pavements	The roads are in bad condition with potholes and are damaging cars. There's Limited parking and untidy streets and pavements.	We'll work closely with Plymouth City Council to identify the roads and pavements that need fixing. We'll also identify areas where more bins could be placed to encourage dog owners and litterers to dispose of there mess appropriately.	2022/ 2023
Improve the local area	We want Barne Barton to be an area people are proud to live in.	Carry out more garden and property inspections to see what necessary works are required to improve their appearance. Such as the painting of the exterior of properties, clearance of gardens and the general upgrade of some areas.	2022/ 2023
Improve the environment	Fly tipping and littering is an issue in the area.	Tackle fly tipping and work with Plymouth City Council to increase the number of litter bins and road sweeping/litter picking.	2022/ 2023

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
